This month we honor the incredible Alba Witkin, a long-time Schools Fund donor, who passed away on December 26. Civic activist, humanitarian, and philanthropist, Alba's contributions to the Berkeley community are unparalleled.



"Alba Witkin stood out among philanthropists for her common sense, passion, and generosity for causes she believed in. Her focus on youth brought her to the Schools Fund over thirty years ago. Grants from the Witkin Charitable Foundation built an expanded Rosa Parks, enhanced Longfellow Auditorium, provided gap funding for the music program, stocked school libraries, and in recent years strengthened the BUSD preschool program with books and supplies. Alba's optimism and commitment to those
