"Persevere" was born out of 2nd grade teacher Lisa Rossi's Schools Fund Classroom Grant for <u>Berkeley Rep's Story Builders</u> program. Rossi explains, "We absolutely loved our time with Carla, our Berkeley Rep instructor, and the students were able to move so much of what they learned into our language arts curriculum. We used these skills to write, narrate, and act in 'Persevere."
