

2015-16 Strategic Impact Grants Awarded



In January, the Schools Fund
Board awarded the final round
of Strategic Impact grants for
the 2015-2016 school year,
bringing this year's total to over
\$195,000. You can check out the
full list of grants here. Strategic
Impact Grants are larger grants

serving the grade, department, school, inter-district, or District level. The grants involve teacher collaboration on a project or coordination with an outside organization.

This year's grants—which include Community Partnerships with organizations such as Lawrence Berkeley National Laboratory, Berkeley Symphony, Community Resources for Science, and others—supported projects in a wide range of subject areas. Over \$69,000 went to STEM projects and over \$62,000 went to Arts programs. We're also funding Language Arts and Student Support projects, including lots of Professional Development.
